May-June 2012. Led a group of 19 students to Bulgaria, Greece, and Turkey, to visit cultural sites, including Orthodox churches and monasteries, the ancient site of Philippi, and Istanbul. We also did two home-stays: one with Slavic Bulgarians, and one in a village of Muslim-Bulgarians (Pomaks).

Fall 2014 Semester. "East / West Connections." Led a group of 20 students to Bulgaria, Greece, and Istanbul. This semester-long trip included homestays, language study, site visits, community service (including work in a Syrian refugee camp), and lectures from local experts and academics.

Summer 2018. "Marginal(ized) Europe." Led a group of 20 students to Bulgaria and Greece. This six-week trip included homestays with Bulgarian families in Plovdiv, Bulgarian language study, site visits in Bulgaria and Greece, and lectures from local experts and academics.
